## **Active Ageing**


The graduates from the Master's programme in Active Ageing are able to work in multiprofessional communities of practice that support the rehabilitation and wellbeing of older people. They also have the ability to carry out demanding development and management tasks. They have a wide-ranging knowledge of ageing and the ability to develop, assess, modernise and manage services. The graduates know how to contribute to the health, well-being and functional capability of older people, as well as to their inclusion and opportunity to participate.

The studies are planned and implemented together with social and health care professionals and organisations. The core educational content includes:

- » Competence in ageing
- » Rehabilitation
- » Management and leadership studies
- » Research and development studies

The studies can be pursued alongside work. Approximately 70% of the courses can be taken as independent distance studies using web-based environments. The programme includes a total of 30 days of contact teaching, which are usually implemented in two consecutive days at a time. Some courses are organised together with other Master's programmes of Karelia UAS.

The Master's degree of universities of applied sciences gives the same qualification for public posts as the Master's degrees provided by universities. The graduates can find employment in the public, private or third sector and apply for various types of development and management tasks that relate to ageing.
